

CITY OF MELROSE PARKING REGULATIONS

The Council adopted parking regulations for the City in February of 2001. At their July 15, 2004 meeting, the Council made revisions to these regulations. The following is a summary of the regulations:

Downtown Business District Parking Regulations

The following areas are designated as the Downtown Business District:

- ◆ Main St E from 1st Ave NE/SE to 5th Ave NE/SE
- ◆ 1st St NE from Riverside Ave NE to 5th Ave NE
- ◆ 1st St SE from 2nd Ave SE to 4th Ave SE
- ◆ 2nd Ave SE/NE from Turkey Lane SE to 1st St NE
- ◆ 3rd Ave SE/NE from Turkey lane SE to 1st St NE
- ◆ 4th Ave SE/NE from Turkey Lane to 1st St NE
- ◆ 5th Ave NE/SE from 1st St SE to 1st St NE

No vehicle shall be parked or stopped in the Downtown Business District on any day, except Sunday, for a continuous period of more than three hours between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. **Exceptions** are 1st St NE from Riverside Ave NE to 5th Ave NE and Turkey Lane SE from 2nd Ave SE to 4th Ave SE. **Parking is prohibited in the Downtown Business District from 3:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. daily from November 1 to April 1.** Signs are posted indicating the restrictions.

Truck, Truck-Tractor, Recreational Parking

No truck, truck-tractor or semi-trailer shall park on a City street in the City, except when loading or unloading. No travel trailer, pick-up coach, motor home, camping trailer, recreational vehicle, or other trailer can be left or parked on any street, right-of-way, or in a City-owned parking lot in the City for a continuous period in excess of 24 hours, except where signs are erected designating the place as a camp site or in a mobile home park.

Time Limitation on Parking

No vehicle shall be parked or allowed to stand for more than 24 hours on any of the public streets or alleys in the City.

Snow Emergency & Maintenance Parking Restrictions

Whenever an emergency exists because of snow, freezing rain, sleet, ice, drifts or other natural phenomena, or whenever it becomes necessary for snow removal or maintenance work on any streets in the City, an emergency may be declared to exist and will restrict parking for a period of twenty-four hours.

Violations of these Parking Regulations will result in a penalty to the owner or operator of the vehicle parked in violation.
